


LES ROCHES QUI DANSENT (THE DANCING ROCKS) ERÔME The Wine Route

Forget everything as you ride along the small roads of this hilly countryside between the Rhône Valley and Drôme des Collines with exceptional and unexpected experiences along the way.

ROADBOOK

- **10 km** Go down to the N7 and turn right onto "route de Serves".
- 2 1,4 km Turn left at the stop sign.
- 3 1,5 km Turn right onto the N7 then first right going past the old railway station.
- 4 2,1 km Turn right onto "route des belvédères" going through Puy-de-Serves.
- **5 9,2 km** Continue along "route des fruitiers".
- 6 10,5 km Turn left onto the D163 and follow the signs for "Drôme à Vélo" cycling route N°9 classified red for 10km.
- 7 21,2 km Turn left onto "route des bois".
- 8 22,9 km Turn right then left at the stop sign and head towards Larnage.
- **9 25,4 km** Turn right onto "route des Côtes-de-Meyer".
- **10 25,8 km** Turn right onto "route des Charrets".
- Charrets".

 11 27,1 km Turn left onto the tourist route.

- 12 27,2 km Follow the signs "belvedere de Pierre Aiguille", continue to Crozes.
- **13** 31 km Go through Crozes and then straight on.
- 32,2 km Follow the small road on the right straight after the railway bridge.
- **(3) 33,6 km** Turn right at the stop sign and go through Gervans and straight on.
- 35,5 km Once in Erôme turn left over the railway line and go down "la montée du pavé".
- **17 35,7 km** Cross the N7 and continue on "route de Saint-Antoine".
- 18 36,1 km Turn right onto "route de la plaine".
- 36,6 km Turn right onto "chemin des Clots".
- 20 37,1 km Cross the N7 again onto the "rue du cimetière".

† PUY DE SERVE VIEWPOINT : After an uphill climb on a forest path, you will come to a plateau, in a somewhat untouched nature. The perspective is captivating in every way.

2 THE DANCING ROCKS: It is just as if a little bit of the mythical forest of Brocéliande had gone astray. Rocks sculptured with the ages forming strange shapes can be found there, ssh... they say that druids are closeby! Leave the rest to your imagination.

3 CASTLE OF LARNAGE: Nestling in its cocoon of vines, the château is the ideal place to contemplate, in spite of it being in ruins. You may even be tempted to open a bottle of wine.



PICNIC CORNER: Amongst "the dancing rocks" look for the most beautiful one and stay there for a brief, intimate moment.

ALITTLE PONUS

A geological crossroads. Here even the rock carries the name of a cake. The blocks are called "poudingues". The pebbles cimented together with sand remind you of the glacé fruit in an English pudding.
