AOC Clairette de Die


Clairette de Die is the most widely known and the oldest of all the AOCs in the Diois : it obtained the appellation in 1942. Muscat grape (75 % minimum) and Clairette grape (25% maximum) variety are used to produce this sparkling wine.


AOC Crémant de Die

This dry white sparkling wine is produced using the Clairette grape variety, the aligoté and muscat grapes are also part of its composition. An AOC since 1993, it is produced in accordance with the traditional method, with an initial fermentation in the vat and a second one in the bottle.

AOC Coteaux de Die

This still, dry white wine is produced using 100% clairette grapes. In common with the Crémant, it obtained its AOC appellation in 1993.

Admirably situated on a terrace overlooking the Drôme, the top of **Vercheny** is forgotten by the hurried motorists who only see the lower town bordering the departmental road. However, sheltered from the world and its tumult, the work of the winegrowers takes place under the sumptuous spectacle of the small wooded peaks of the middle valley of the Drôme, dominated by the imposing diadem of the Trois Becs, whose arched cliffs border the Forêt de Saoû. The Clairette de Die is, here, an ancient history. The importance of the vineyard is the best proof. So, what could be more natural than the choice of Vercheny to host an educational trail that details in detail the different stages of the culture of the vine?

Itinerary of the Trail

Starting point :

From Die go down towards Valence for 15 km. In Vercheny, take the small road that leads to Vercheny-le-Haut. After a series of twists and turns, you reach the hamlet of Peyrache. The parking area and the starting point of the circuit are located a hundred meters further, near the war memorial and the green sign : Découvrir la Vigne.
